The Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation made headlines recently when it donated a \$5 million grant to PBS Hawaii, the state's only public television channel.

The funds will help the station find a brand-new facility after it lost its lease with the University of Hawaii at Manoa after some 40 years. The funds will enable the station to construct a new building near Nimitz Highway. It will be named the Clarence T.C. Ching Campus in honor of the generous gift.

"The Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation wants to see public television survive and thrive for the sake of future generations of Islanders," said Ching Foundation trustee Kenneth Okamoto. "PBS Hawaii is making an indelible difference in the lives of thousands of young people through its innovative program, HIKI NO: The Nation's First Statewide Student News Network."

According to its website, the foundation was first established in 1967 by its namesake, Clarence T.C. Ching, to help people in need of financial assistance.
