This past year your support gave us the momentum to:

...bring diverse voices and perspectives together to discuss important community issues on **INSIGHTS ON PBS HAWAII'I**. Live streaming allowed real-time engagement on social media with viewers around the globe.

We reached beyond over-the-air television with new initiatives, behind-the-scenes interviews and special guest appearances.

...build new relationships with Hawai'i filmmakers and feature their work on **PBS Hawai'i Presents**. We will continue to be a vessel for our talent-rich film community.

...welcome back **PBS Hawai'i Keiki Club** members with a spook-tacular Trunk o' Treat drive-through event. I am not sure who had more fun, the keiki or the PBS Hawai'i staff.

...share authentic stories about Hawai'i's local cultures and traditions through our local

weekly audio podcast, **What School You Went?** The growing number of listeners confirms what we have always known... Hawai'i is a special place that people love calling home.

And last but not least, this momentum helped us envision, **Home is Here**, a new local series that will take you deep into neighborhoods across Hawai'i, and provide an inside peek at how we live, work and play. Stay tuned to learn more as we premiere our show next month.

## Kainani Kahaunaele

**Monday, January 31 at 7:30 pm**

Kainani Kahaunaele has been a force in Hawaiian music for the last two decades. She garnered multiple awards for her albums *Na'u 'Oe* (2003) and *'Ōhai 'Ula* (2010). Most recently at the 2021 Nā Hōkū Hanohano Awards she won a total of seven trophies, including album of the year, for her most recent release *Waipunalei*.

Not only has she enjoyed success as a solo recording artist, but her gift for haku mele (Hawaiian composition) has attracted some of Hawai'i's most renowned artists including Weldon Kekauoha, Aaron Salā, Nā Leo, Lehua Kalima & Shawn Pimental, and Kapono Nā'īlī'ili to record her songs.

When she is not performing or collaborating with the many talented musicians that help bring her mele to life, she teaches at the Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani College of Hawaiian Language and Literature at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. For Kainani, there is no separation between her life as a musician and her life as a teacher of Hawaiian language. "Music infiltrates all parts of my life, and so does Hawaiian language. In my family, in my work, in my music, 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is the main thing."

Fans of her music will immediately recognize the many musical inspirations she draws from, including: jazz, contemporary and R&B, but her commitment to perpetuating the Hawaiian language and haku mele is at the core of everything she does. "To me the language is primary. The poetry is primary. When that is solid any kind of music can accompany [it]."

**PATSY MINK: AHEAD OF THE MAJORITY**

**Thursday, January 27 at 8:30 pm**

Fifty years ago, a fiery, young politician from Pā‘ia, Maui championed federal legislation that changed America. Patsy Takemoto Mink was the principal author of Title IX which passed in 1972. The law was renamed as the Patsy T. Mink Equal Opportunity in Education Act after Mink died in 2002.

for new levels of achievement by women in law, medicine, science and other disciplines.

To mark the anniversary of the law’s passage, PBS Hawai‘i will broadcast and stream the documentary *Patsy Mink: Ahead of the Majority*, by filmmaker Kimberlee Bassford.

The act states, “No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.”

Throughout her career, Mink was a forceful voice for the rights of immigrants, minorities, women and children. She was turned away from medical school because she was a woman. So she got a law degree and went on to become the first woman of color and the first Asian American elected to Congress.

It mandates academic and athletic equity in America’s universities and although it is most commonly referenced in terms of women’s sports, its passage paved the way

When PBS Hawai‘i first broadcast the film in 2008, Bassford said, “It is a simple story about how one person can make a difference.”

PBS Hawai‘i Presents an encore showing of *Homealani*, a 2012 documentary by Hawai‘i filmmaker Ann Marie Kirk. The film profiles Kirk’s grandfather, Oliver Homealani Kupau, who was born in Hau‘ula, Windward O‘ahu in 1899, a year after the illegal annexation of Hawai‘i by the United States. Kirk shares her grandfather’s journey through Hawai‘i’s transition from an indigenous culture to a U.S. culture while never forgetting his Native Hawaiian roots.

Kupau achieved the rank of colonel in the U.S. Army, at the time making him one of the highest ranking officers of Native Hawaiian ancestry in the U.S. military.

In making the movie, Kirk used 16 mm film her grandfather shot of Hawai‘i in the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s. Kirk was born the year her grandfather died and came to feel that his love of storytelling and film passed to her.
