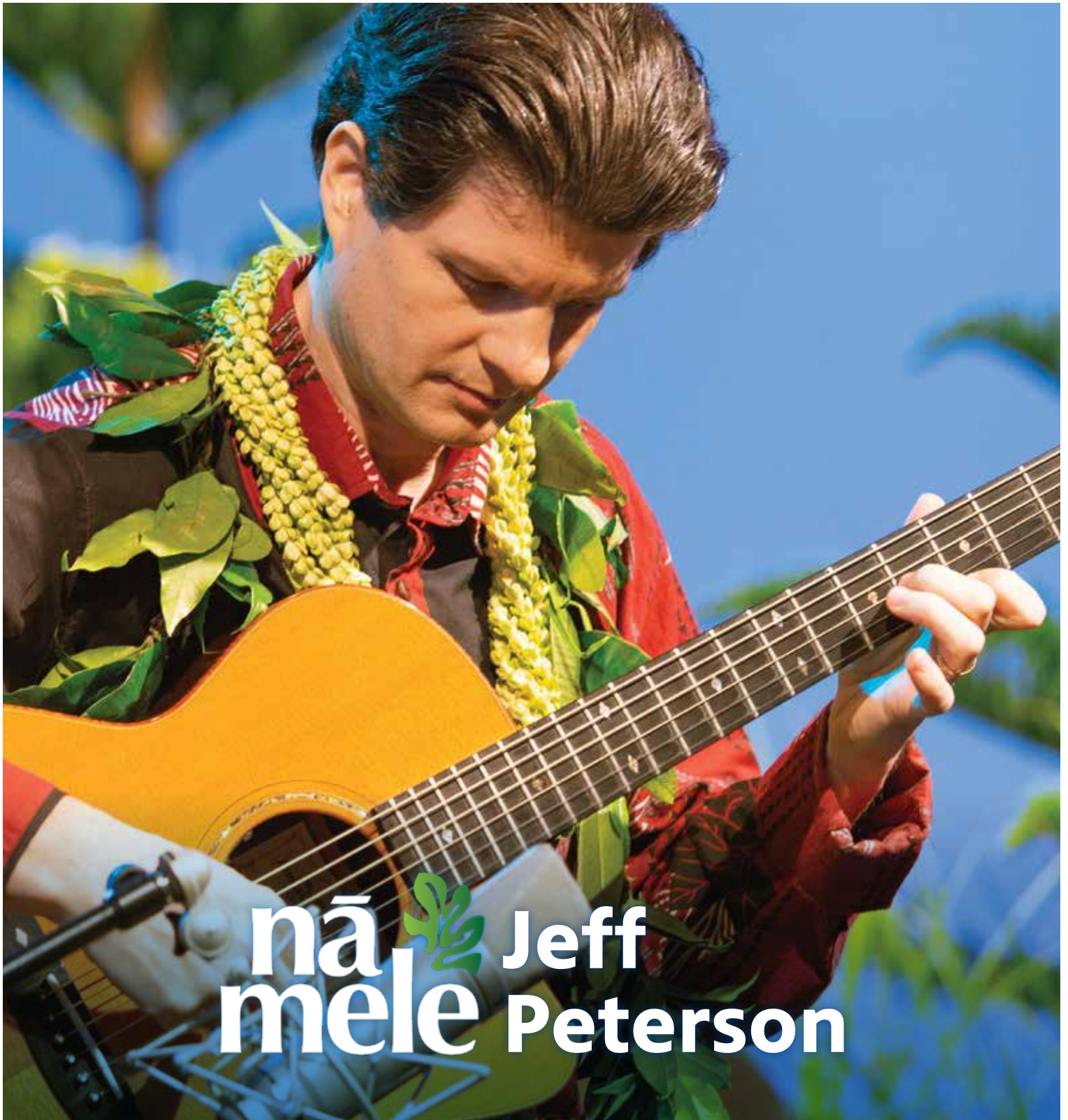


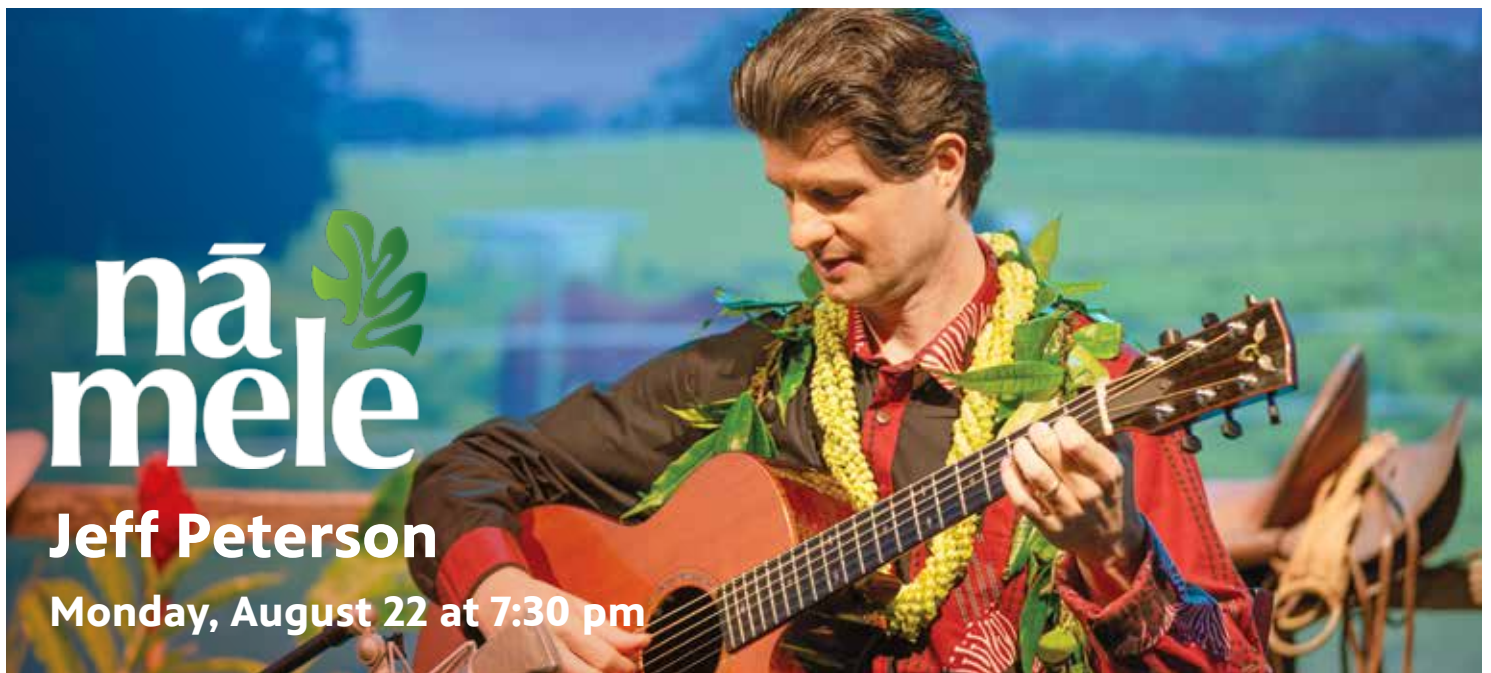


# PBS HAWAI'I

nā mele Jeff Peterson



Some say that music can heal the soul. Well get ready to take in the soothing sounds of this month's **Nā Mele** artist Jeff Peterson.

Born on Maui and raised Upcountry, his father was a paniolo at Haleakala Ranch. Peterson says, "Our backyard was the ranch and the mountain and I love being Upcountry. There's this incredible culture, the paniolo culture that goes back generations and you can still get down to the ocean in about 30 minutes."

His passion for the guitar and exposure to all types of music began at a young age. "I was very fortunate to start hearing recordings long before I got to meet any of the musicians and so I feel there's such an incredible heritage with slack key here in Hawai'i. So, thinking of Gabby Pahinui, Leonard Kwan, Sonny Chillingworth, Ray Kāne, that generation inspired the generation of Keola Beamer, Led Kaapana, the Hawaiian renaissance of the

1970s. Then later, Dancing Cat was a label in the 1990s. George Winston started to record a lot of the great slack key artists and he released these brilliant albums that for me, were just the best thing because they're solo instrumentalists playing and solo singers," says Peterson.

Self-taught, Peterson got a scholarship to attend the University of Southern California, where he expanded his education in jazz and classical music. He says despite his interest in all sorts of musical genres, the core of what he does is the roots of his Hawaiian heritage, his 'ohana and his childhood. "If

I'm playing one song that I've learned from studying classical music, maybe with my right hand, I'll use a technique and I'll play jazz harmony or I'll improvise in a way that a jazz musician would. And so, I like to just find ways to bring different styles and cultures together, but at the heart of it is still the Hawaiian tradition," says Peterson.

The soloist has strummed his way to a remarkable career contributing to two Grammy Award-winning records, eleven Nā Hōkū Hanohano awards, composing and performing the first ever *Concerto for Slack Key Guitar and Orchestra* and traveling the world sharing his music. Despite all this, Peterson says he still works hard at his craft playing his guitar at least two hours a day, sometimes eight hours depending on the project. He says, "To really excel at anything, you just have to make it your life, right? And put your heart and soul into it."



# Home is Here

Wednesday, August 31 at 7:30 pm

Turning 100-years old is no small feat whether you're a person, business or a landmark. And in this month's episode of **Home is Here**, we're sharing two stories that are celebrating a century.

We're off to Mānoa Valley in Honolulu where it's like stepping back in time. Built in 1922, the Salvation Army's Wai'oli Tea Room is a single-story bungalow featuring incredible stone work, an open lānai and is surrounded by a beautiful garden. When it opened, it served as a classroom where orphans at the Salvation Army Girls Home could learn skills like cooking and food service.

The tea room closed in 2014 and sat empty until Ross and Stefanie Anderson opened the Waioli Kitchen & Bake Shop in 2018. They're embracing the original spirit of Wai'oli by providing vocational training for individuals who have undergone substance abuse treatment and who were previously incarcerated. They're not just serving food; they're serving second chances.

"We want to encourage the girls to have a spirit of excellence in everything that they do. That's why we don't do a huge menu, we just want to do a few things and do them really, really well," says Ross Anderson. "Our heart for our people isn't that they're going to become restaurateurs or great chefs, it's just giving them that chance to start dreaming again. So many of them have lost the dream of what their life could be," says Stefanie Anderson.

Born in 1922 in Hilo, Hawai'i Island, Ella Fujie has a lifetime of stories to tell. A lover of flowers and art, she raised five children, traveled around the world and worked until her mid 90s. She bore witness to historic events like the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the tsunamis that destroyed downtown Hilo and numerous volcanic eruptions. "I cannot imagine I'm 100," says Fujie.

Her family says they are fortunate to have this time with her and to celebrate this milestone. "She always taught me to always be kind to people and show kindness to others," says granddaughter Trisha Roy. "She's been active and the best part is her brain is still sharp. And you know, her stories are great," says son Richard Fujie. Be sure to tune in to find out Ella's secret to her long life.
