



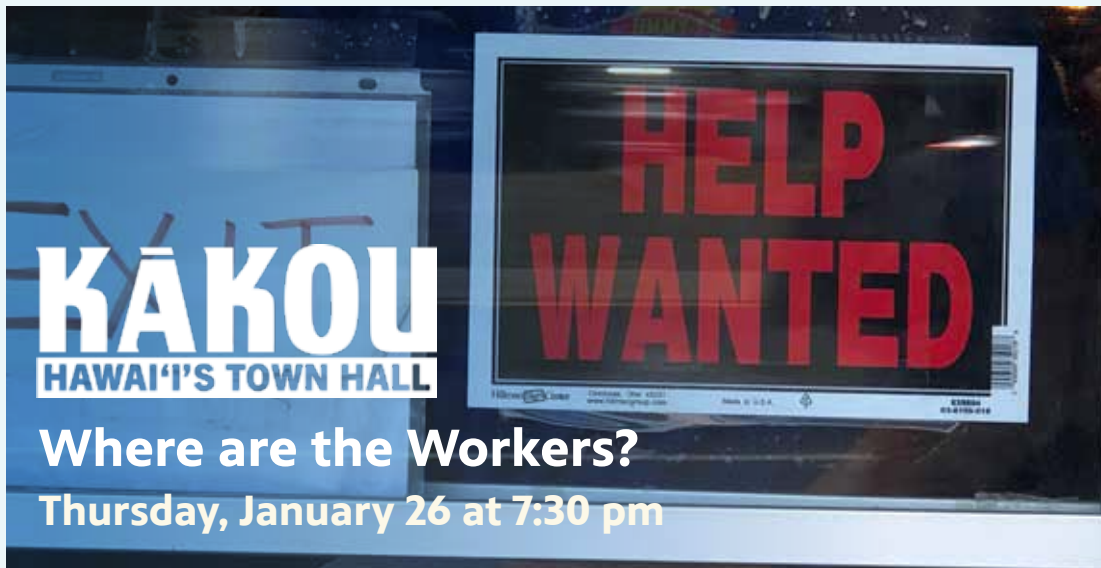

Where are
the Workers?



Want or need a job? Hawai'i is hiring.

But many employers across the state are having a difficult time filling vacancies. This, despite evidence that much of the local economy is on an upswing from the downturn caused by COVID-19 and government-imposed restrictions.

A local restaurant-chain owner says his management staff is handling the catering portion of his business because he cannot find workers. He says he doesn't even get applicants.

Common signs in business districts across the state say, "Now Hiring," "Hiring All Positions-Inquire Within," or "Jobs Available." No matter the message, the need is the same.

The problem is not unique to Hawai'i but it is curious in a state that boasted the lowest unemployment rate in the nation before the pandemic.

So, where are the workers? People who track economic data say there has been out-migration in the past two-plus years. Were all the people who left part of the work force?

Has the work force changed? If so, how?

Are the workers who remain holding out for jobs that pay better than restaurant or retail wages? Is the desire to work from home an issue?

What jobs are workers taking? How are those who are not working surviving when basic living costs like housing and food are so expensive?

Even higher paying industries like healthcare, or those covered by a collective bargaining agreement like tourism and construction, are not immune to the worker shortages.

Neither is an employer in the public sector.

Some employers offer incentives that didn't exist as recently as three years ago to entice new hires, while others have launched training programs for people as young as high-school-age to ensure a work force going forward.

PBS Hawai'i is bringing together industry representatives, organized labor leaders, workers, economists and workforce trainers to discuss this issue in a live 90-minute program. **KĀKOU: Hawai'i's Town Hall, Where Are The Workers?** premieres at 7:30 pm on Thursday, January 26. Viewer questions are welcome.





Home is Here

Wednesday, January 25 at 7:30 pm

Culture takes the spotlight in this month's episode of **Home is Here**, but in two very different ways.

In Kalihi on O'ahu, the non-profit Kōkua Kalihi Valley (KKV) is looking to help the community connect with its cultural roots through food and farming.

It all started at a support group for diabetes patients at KKV's clinic. As any doctor will tell you, one of the keys to healthy living is to get enough exercise, but communicating that message wasn't so simple.

"Oftentimes, they're communicating through a translator," explains Kanoa O'Connor, a youth coordinator at KKV's farm Ho'oulu 'Āina. "[The translator] told our doctors, 'Oh, you know, there's no word in Chuukese, or in any of these languages, for the word exercise.'" As the translator explained, what the patients did know was farming. That sparked the idea to get the patients exercising by having them cultivate a property leased by the clinic in upper Kalihi Valley.

You'll see how the farm has grown to not only provide physical activity, but to provide food for the community in a unique way.

Also featured is a group that gets no shortage of exercise, 808 Breakers. Founded in 2005, the group brings together Hawai'i's elite breakdancers.

"When anybody thinks of Hawai'i, breaking is probably the last thing that they imagine it has a scene for," says Jeff Wong also known as B-Boy Ark.

The group is a celebration of urban and hip-hop culture rooted in the Aloha spirit.

"As a native Hawaiian, I did not fit into a lot of the stereotypes that were presented to me. Growing up, I don't surf. I did a little bit of hula, but I fell out of it," explains Wong. "I am confident that there are youth and adults alike who are searching for a voice. I found mine in this dance, in this culture. I know that the way that we have been perpetuating this dance and allowing it to grow in the islands, that we will provide, or be a part in providing, that outlet for our community here in the islands."

Another major aspect of the group is competition. With breakdancing becoming part of the Olympic Games, one member of 808 Breakers is vying to be America's pick to send to Paris in 2024. Tune in to see him in action!

Jeralee Galea'i first entered fireknife competitions when she was only 12 years old. In many ways her competing was inevitable as she comes from a long line of champions. "The Galea'i family is a fireknife dynasty. If you're born into the Galea'i family you have no choice, you're going to fireknife dance," says Tagaloataoa Delsa Moe, who chairs the Fireknife Competition at the Polynesian Cultural Center, which has hosted the event since its inception in the 1990s.

Jeri follows Galea'i, an 18-year-old Lā'ie, Windward O'ahu resident as she trains for and participates in the 2019 World Fireknife Competition seeking to become the Women's Division champion.
