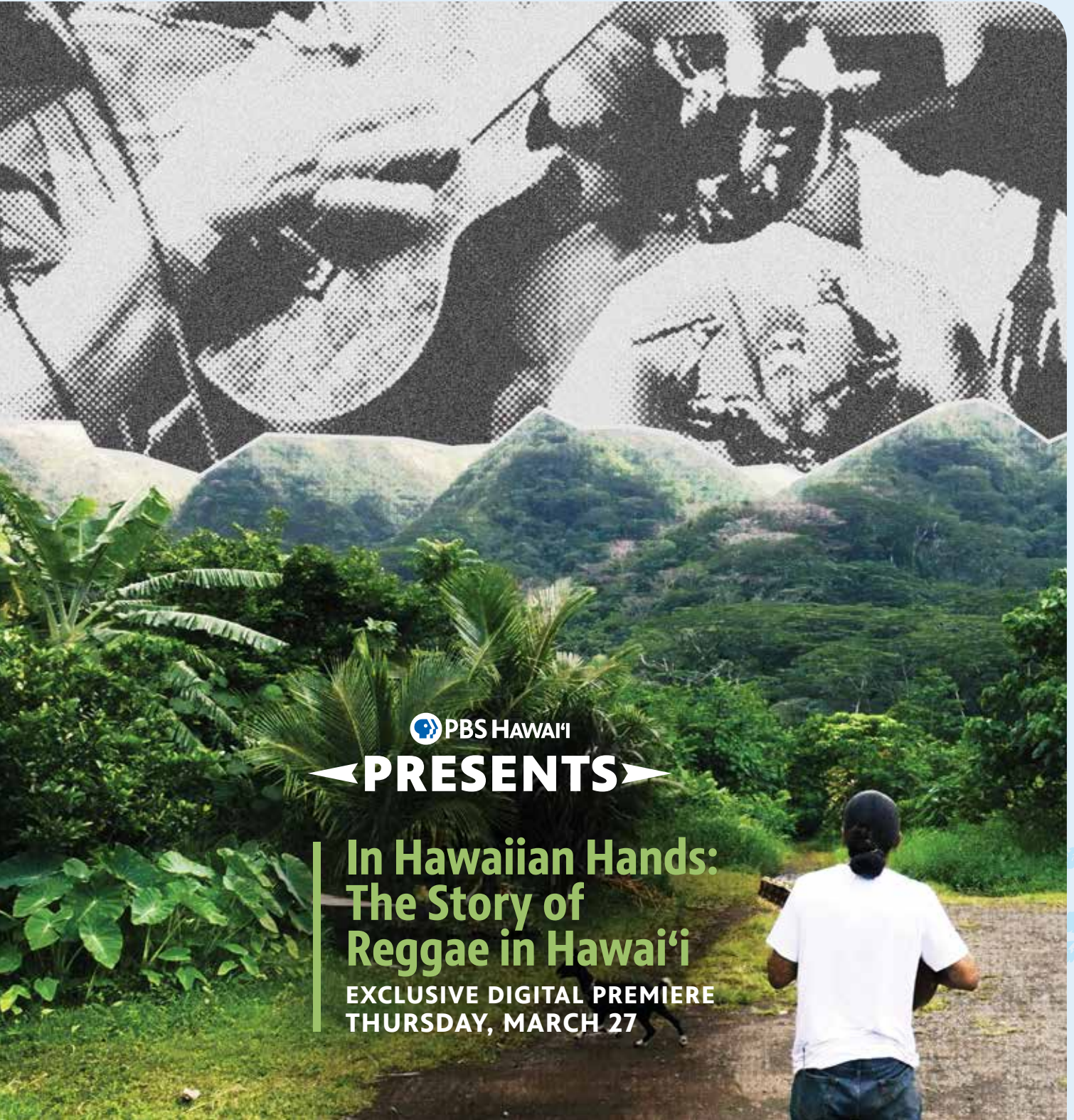

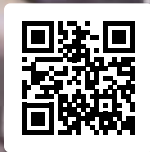

In keeping with our tradition of telling the stories of our community, we shine a spotlight on one undeniable, yet largely untold chapter in the history of our music.

The late 1960s ushered in a new musical genre for Jamaica, emerging from the sounds of ska and rocksteady. Coined “reggae,” it served as both a vehicle to deliver messages of resistance to colonialism and slavery, and a symbol of culture and unity. Expanding beyond the Caribbean

to our shores, reggae music and all it stood for instantly resonated with our people, and the mark it left was indelible. But along with the arrival of reggae came examinations of cultural identity and authenticity.

In Hawaiian Hands: The Story of Reggae in Hawai'i is a three-part documentary series produced by PBS Hawai'i, and is a digital exclusive, available for streaming only on our YouTube channel and pbshawaii.org. The films aim to

fill a blank in our history book, while attempting to answer age-old questions from an often contentious conversation. Did the introduction of one culture's music come at the expense of our own? Has reggae transcended its origins to become that vehicle for another people's own self-expression, or are we simply engaging in appropriation?

The series will trace the popularity and evolution of reggae in the Islands, from roots to the Jawaiian era, the precursor to today's island music. Part I, titled “Roots of Creation,” documents how the first local artists embraced and interpreted the new sound.

The Polynesian Voyaging Society (PVS) spearheaded construction of the 60-foot double-hulled canoe 50 years ago and launched it into the ocean at Kualoa on the windward side of O‘ahu on March 8, 1975.

Hökūle‘a is a replica of voyaging canoes Polynesian explorers sailed

across vast expanses of the Pacific Ocean to populate what is known as the Polynesian triangle with New Zealand (Aotearoa), Hawai‘i and Rapa Nui (Easter Island) at its points and multiple island nations in between including Tahiti, Samoa, Tonga and the Tuamotu islands.
