Home is Here

Honoka'a

This month's episode of **Home is Here** features the town of Honoka'a, which sits along the Hāmākua Coast of the island of Hawai'i. Originally, our crew set out to do a single story on the Honoka'a Heritage Center. After talking with staff members and residents, we immediately felt their love and sense of pride for their community and decided to expand the story.



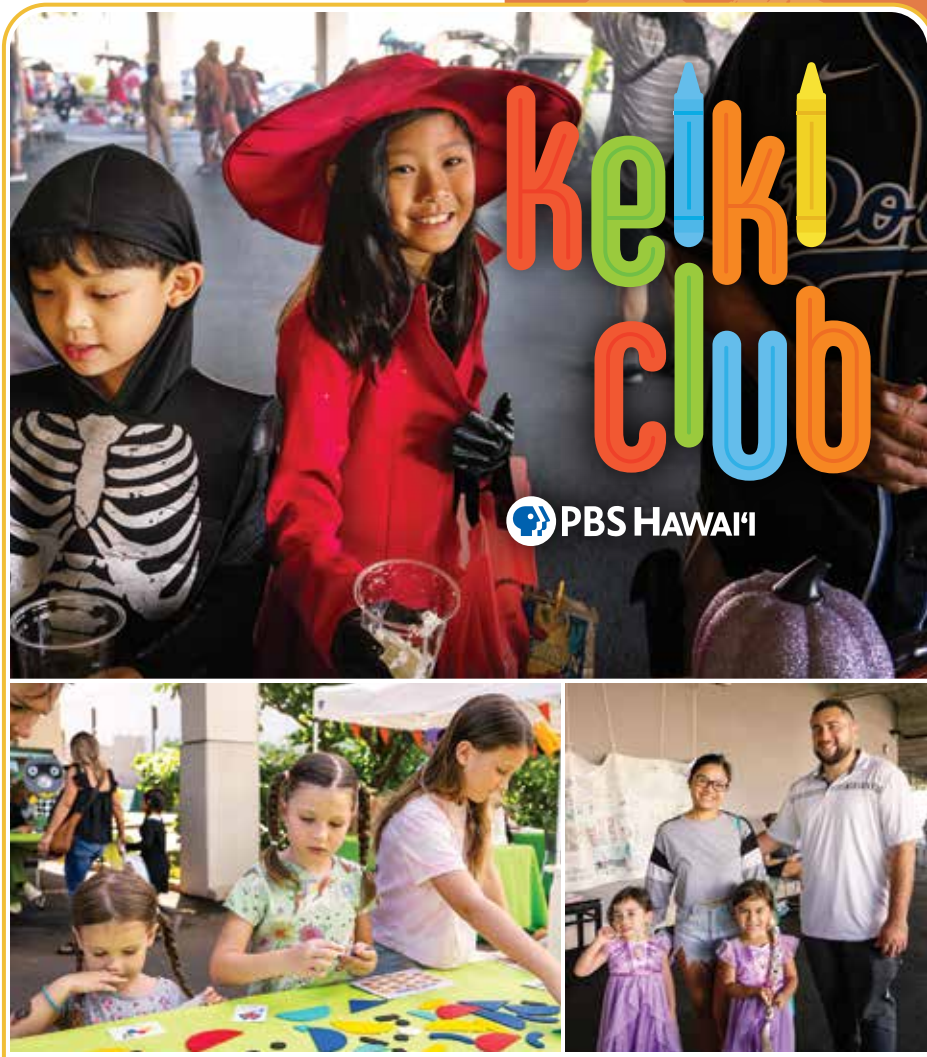
Like many small towns across the state, Honoka'a's economy and lifestyle once centered around a sugar plantation. Its multicultural community was formed in the late 19th and early 20th centuries when migrant workers from across the globe arrived in the islands.

"Everyone that came here, came here for the plantation, whether you ended up working in it or not," says Honoka'a resident F. Bernadette Botelho.

After more than a century, the last sugar plantation in the area, Hāmākua Sugar Company, closed in 1994. It was a blow to the entire community. "Because we're a commuter town and because of the closure of the plantation, so many people live here and have to travel elsewhere. So that has changed the feel of the town," says Honoka'a Heritage Center (HHC) Executive Director Nicole Garcia.

Today, Honoka'a relies a lot on tourism. A big part of the town's charm is its history. If you take a stroll through downtown, you'll see several plantation era buildings. "Growing up in Honoka'a, you don't realize how special the town is because of its architecture, because of the buildings that are still here," says Honoka'a resident Darde Gamayo.

You will also find the Honoka'a Heritage Center where staff and volunteers are preserving and celebrating the history of the town. "I'd like more of the younger generation to learn about the town and how it came to be and all the important figures behind it," says HHC Museum Assistant Sandy Takahashi. And if you stop by the Heritage Center, Garcia says there's a good chance you can sit and talk story with the locals, "We sort of have become that hub for the old timers and the generational families to come and gather."

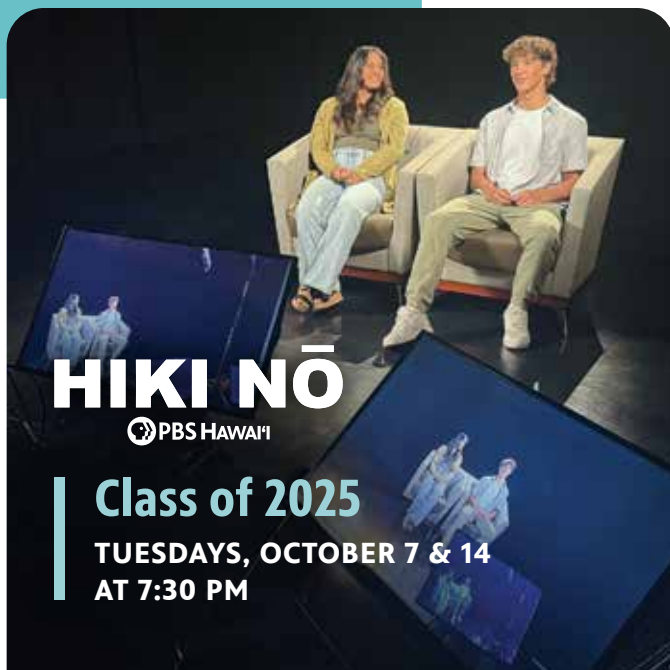

We experience and express faith in many different ways. For some, faith is rooted in organized religion. Others find it in culture, family, or community. In a place shaped by diverse traditions and histories, definitions of faith are far from singular. Differences in values and beliefs can bring both connection and tension.

The word itself has varied meanings, including allegiance to a person or duty, loyalty, sincerity in intentions or promises, trust, a strong conviction, hope, purpose, meaning, obedience, devotion, guidance, value and more. Many of these definitions, it not most, are tied to theology and the concept of believing without seeing.

Faith can keep us grounded through both good times and challenging times.

The phrase "have faith" is common in conversation, used for variety of contexts and usually with good intentions. But why do

we have faith? What role does it play in our society? Is it something that comes naturally or does it need to be cultivated? What does it mean to lose faith?
