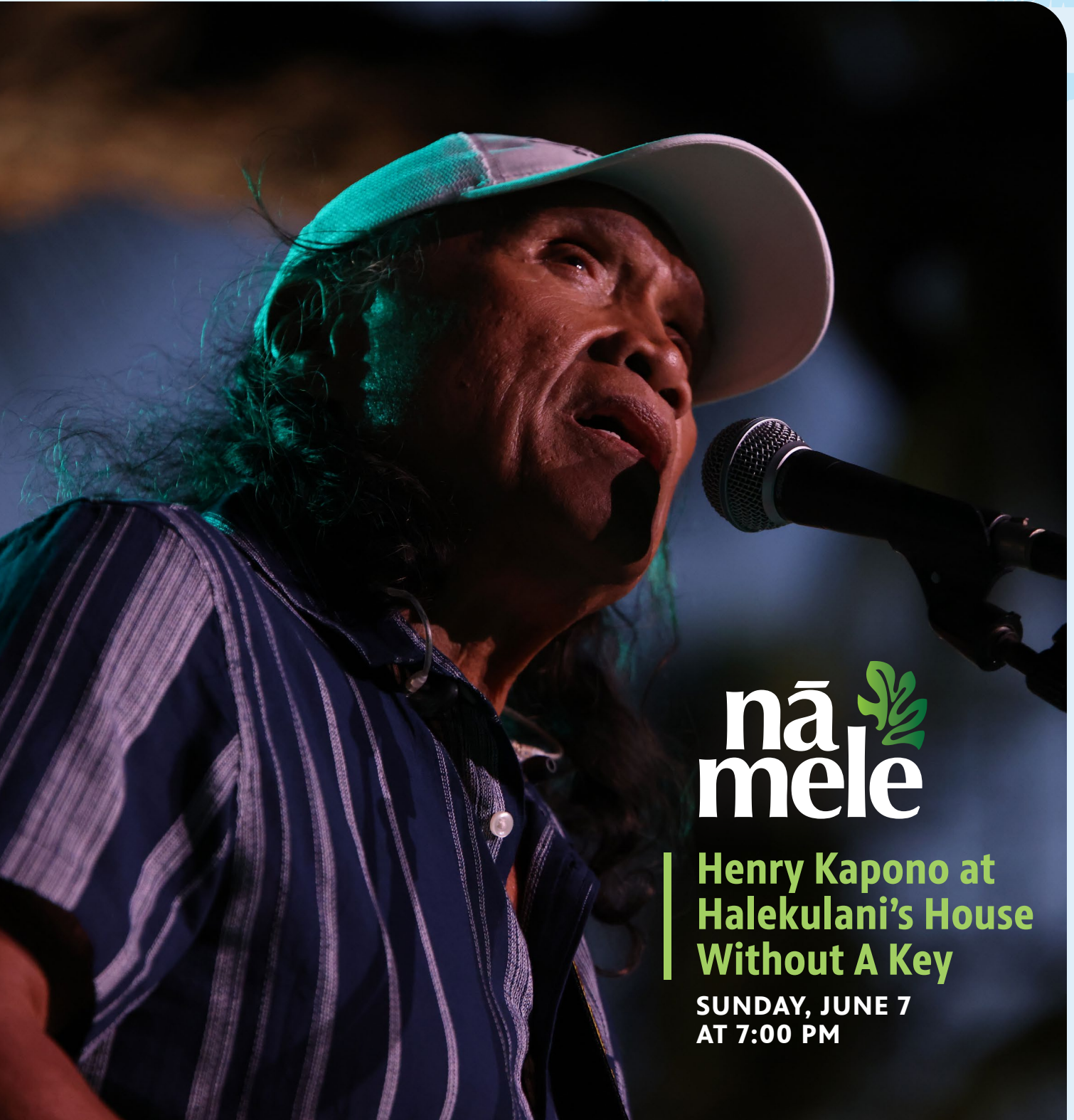

CEO MESSAGE

Aloha mai kākou,

I still remember sitting on the grass at the Waikīkī Shell, “under the stars,” as Uncle Tom Moffatt used to say ... listening to the harmonies of Cecilio & Kapono. Their music floated out over the crowd, the Shell carrying its own atmosphere that anyone who grew up here would recognize. Songs like “Friends,” “Highway in the Sun,” “Sailin’” and “Gotta Get Away” became part of Hawai‘i’s soundtrack, playing at backyard parties, graduation nights and long summer evenings. Those moments reminded us what it feels like when Hawai‘i comes together.

As we head into the summer months and continue our 60th anniversary year, that same sense of togetherness is what we want to honor. This has been a year of real change for PBS Hawai‘i, and the response from longtime supporters to first-time donors has been steady, generous and humbling. Your trust is helping us move through this moment with intention.

Losing federal funding after decades of support forced us to rethink how we sustain our mission. Instead of pulling back, we chose to lean into our independence and strengthen our connection to the people we serve. The strong donor response this year tells us that Hawai‘i values trusted, independent media and believes in the work we do together.

Because of that support, we continue to provide educational programming for keiki, trusted PBS favorites for families and kūpuna, and local storytelling through **Nā Mele, Home is Here, INSIGHTS on PBS Hawai‘i, KĀKOU: Hawai‘i’s Town Hall, HIKI NŌ on PBS Hawai‘i** and more. These programs reflect who we are as an island community and why public media matters.

This month, during our June pledge drive, we’re proud to feature the special **Nā Mele: Henry Kapono at Halekulani’s House Without A Key**, premiering Sunday, June 7 at 7:00 pm. Kapono’s music, like the C&K era that shaped so many of us, has carried Hawai‘i through five decades. His voice, stories and connection to our islands remind us why local storytelling deserves to be cared for and carried forward.

As we celebrate 60 years, we’re also looking ahead. In many Asian cultures, turning 60 marks the end of one full cycle and the start of renewal. That feels true for us. ELECTION 2026

Election 2026 kicks into high gear this month with the June 2 deadline for candidates to file paperwork to run for office. PBS Hawai'i will feature candidates in several contests leading up to the primary election, Saturday, August 8 and the general election, Tuesday, November 3.

There are several big races across the state this year including for governor and lieutenant governor. Candidates for these two offices run separately in the primary and the winners in the respective political parties then run as a ticket in the general.

Voters in Kaua'i will elect a new mayor as there will be no incumbent on the ballot. There is also a mayoral race for Maui County. Both Hawai'i seats in the U.S. House will be on the ballot. In the State Senate, 13 of the 25 seats are up for election as are all 51 seats in the State House. Also on the ballot are five of the nine seats on the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, all nine seats on the Hawai'i County Council, all nine seats on the Maui County Council, all seven seats on the Kaua'i County Council and four of the nine seats on the Honolulu City Council.

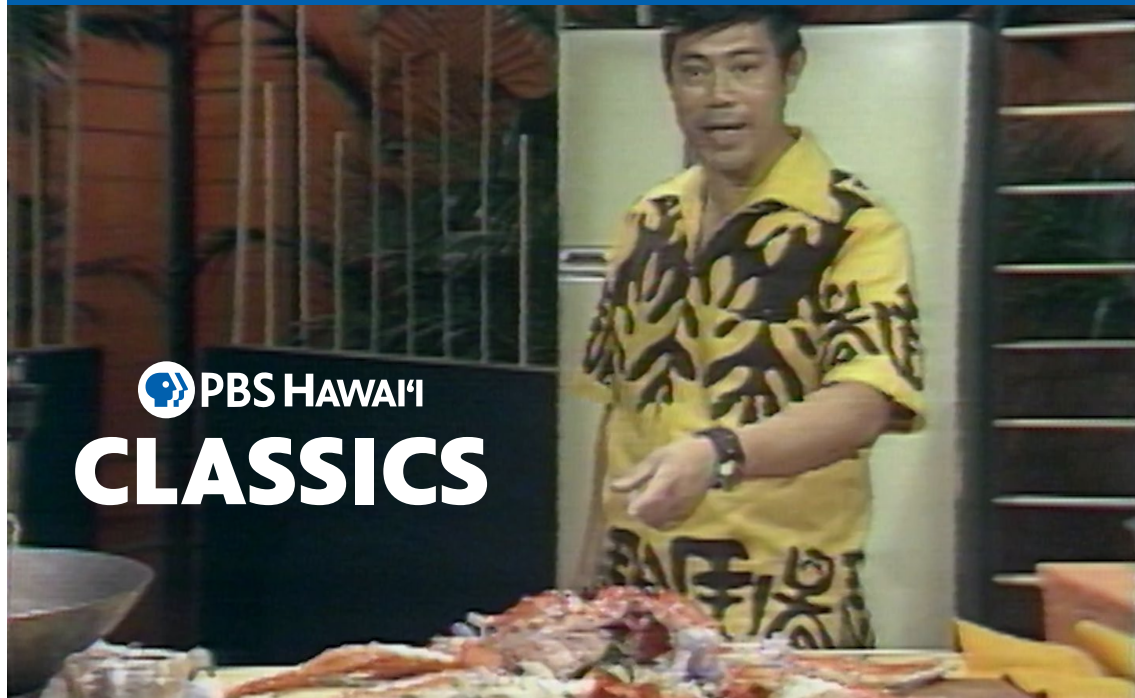
