Taimane

Taimane is known for her virtuosic technique in playing the ‘ukulele, blending musical styles and expressive stage presence.

Born and raised in Hawai‘i, Taimane Gardner received her first ‘ukulele from her father at the age of 5. She was discovered while busking on the streets of Waikīkī and was given her first professional job when she was 13, playing with legendary entertainer Don Ho. Since then, Taimane has forged her own path.

“When I first started playing ‘ukulele, I got a lot of my music playing covers and I learned a lot about how song structures work,” says Taimane. “But

I was kind of getting a little burnt out by the age of 15. I was playing “Wipeout” over and over and over and by that time, I learned a lot but I was wanting to blossom.”

Taimane began experimenting with original music, finding inspiration in the universe. She says, “I started with creating music about the planets and then it naturally just felt normal to go into the elements. Because if you think about the planets, they also connect with the elements in a certain way too. You know, Mars, fire. And so then naturally I'm starting to think about my next album could be the zodiac, the astrological signs, Aries, fire, Mars. They're all connected in that way.”

The multi-Nā Hōkū Hanohano award winner continues to elevate the ‘ukulele, challenging the stereotype of it being a simple or limited instrument. “The things that I still want to accomplish with my music is to continue down the path that I'm already doing, which is touring, meeting new people through my music but on a bigger scale. And I'm very appreciative of PBS Hawai‘i sharing my music through this way. And I just want to keep doing that. I want to keep showing people that the ‘ukulele is more than just a toy, and you can play really weird things on it. You can express yourself through this instrument.”



After earning recognition as the Most Promising Artist at the 2014 Nā Hōkū Hanohano Awards, Honolulu-based Yoza seemed destined for stardom. But behind the music, she was battling addiction that nearly cost her both her life and career. In an intimate profile, Yoza reflects on the difficult road to recovery, the power of family and how finding peace and healing gives new meaning to her music and life.

Tucked away in an old building in the McCully neighborhood of Honolulu, Truest Hawaii has earned an international reputation as one of the world’s premier sneaker shops, attracting collectors, athletes, musicians and celebrities in search of rare footwear. Yet despite its global acclaim, Truest has never lost sight of its local roots. Owner John Om remains grounded in aloha and loyal to the local community that has made it all possible.

For tattoo practitioner Kawika Au, kākau, the Hawaiian word for tattoo, is more than just body art. It is a sacred cultural practice that connects people to their place, genealogy and identity. Working in the traditions of pre-contact Hawai‘i, Au preserves ancestral techniques and values while helping to revitalize an art form that nearly disappeared. Each mark he makes tells a story that honors the past and reaffirms the present.

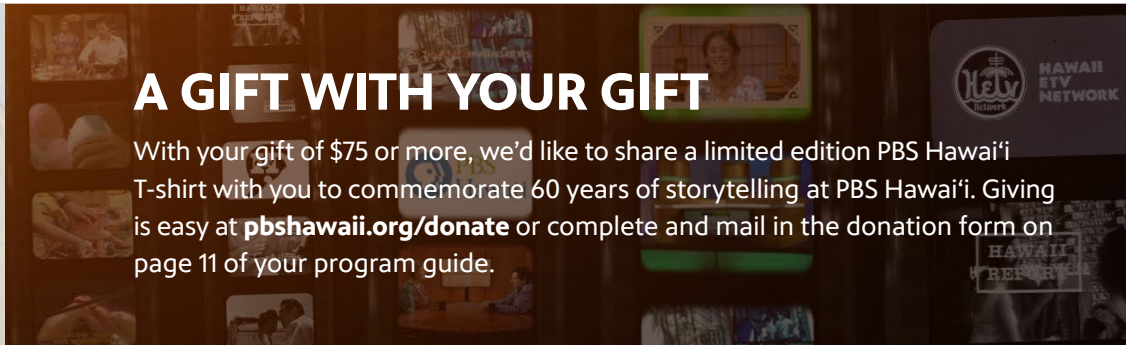

The Island in Me Thursday, August 27, 8:30 pm

The Island in Me is an award-winning documentary that takes the viewer to the Polynesian atoll of Pukapuka, a one-of-a-kind place in the Cook Islands in the South Pacific never before captured on film. With only four hundred inhabitants and land only 10 meters above sea level, the atoll has stories to tell.

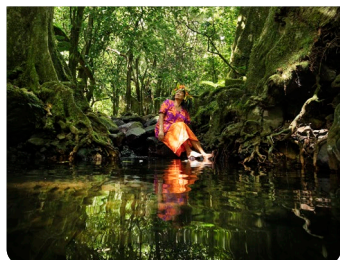


The film, directed by Gemma Cubero del Barrio, follows two women: Amelia Hokule'a Borofsky, daughter of anthropologist Robert Borofsky who lived in Pukapuka in the mid 1970s; and Johnny Frisbie, a Cook Island legend in her own right and author. It charts their journey from Hawai'i back to their beloved childhood home.

Immediately, following is a short film, also directed by del Barrio, called **Our Atoll Speaks**. Del Barrio describes the short as a "meditation on the environmental knowledge" of the people of Pukapuka. Residents of this community live by strict rules dictated by their environment and passed down through thousands of years. Now they find their home threatened by the effects of a changing climate.

Pacific Heartbeat

The anthology series **PACIFIC HEARTBEAT**, now in its 13th season, provides a glimpse of the real Pacific: its people, cultures, languages, music and contemporary issues. Across five episodes, an array of films draws viewers into the heart and soul of Pacific Islander experiences. The nationally distributed series is a production of Pacific Islanders in Communications (PIC) in partnership with PBS Hawai'i.



TE PUNA ORA (THE SOURCE OF LIFE) Saturday, August 22, 8:00 pm

Follow three indigenous women in Tahiti – a community leader, a spear fisher and a teenage activist – as they cultivate an alliance at the front lines of climate change. Inspired by the myths and rituals that shape their culture, they move beyond bureaucracy toward ground-up empowerment. The film includes scenes of reenactment from the legend of goddess Hina while she, like them, sails through the South Pacific, faces a storm and finds purpose.



A PARADISE LOST Saturday, August 29, 8:00 pm

O'ahu filmmaker Laurie Sumiye documents the strange and curious tale of a Hawaiian finch who sued the State of Hawai'i to prevent its imminent extinction, the first animal in history named lead plaintiff in a federal lawsuit. The film weaves animation, archival footage and cultural preservation to visualize the landmark environmental case "Palila v. Hawai'i" as told by the stuffed palila bird who sat at the plaintiff's desk.

CHATSWORTH THROUGH TIME Sunday, August 9, 8:00 pm

Explore the history, architecture, landscape and artwork of Chatsworth House, an English estate and home of one of Europe's most significant collections of fine art. Beginning in the Tudor Period, journey through five hundred years of history, including a conversation with the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire.

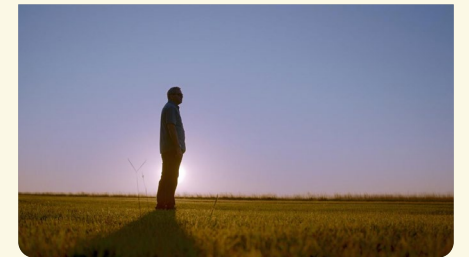
DOLLY PARTON: HERE I AM Sunday, August 16, 7:00 pm

Thursdays, September 3-17 at 8:30 pm

As part of Hawaiian History Month, PBS Hawai'i is sharing a three-part documentary the station produced in 1987 called **HAWAIIANS**. The series celebrates Hawaiian culture and history. It begins with chants telling the story of the discovery and settlement of these islands by Polynesian explorers, then chronicles the changes brought on by Western contact and concludes with how modern Hawaiians are rejuvenating and preserving their culture.
