Aloha mai kākou,

October is always a special month at PBS Hawai'i. It's when our mission comes through in ways our youngest learners can see and feel.

As Hawai'i's only locally owned, statewide public television station, our commitment to keiki is one of the most important responsibilities we carry. Creating safe places for children to learn and grow has always guided our work – and it still does.

This month, we welcome families to two community events that celebrate imagination and play. Trunk O' Treat, on our campus, brings Keiki Club members together for a morning of costumes, creativity and PBS KIDS fun. For the past five years, my wife Paige and I have dressed as the Cat in the Hat and Thing 1. It has become a tradition we enjoy because of the excitement on the faces of keiki who recognize characters they love.

At O'ahu's Pearlridge Center, Candy Crawl draws nearly 5,000 community members each year. Both events give keiki a chance to explore, meet new friends and enjoy safe, welcoming spaces to celebrate Halloween with their families.

These gatherings remind us that learning does not only happen in classrooms or on screens. It

happens in small moments of joy, curiosity and connection. They also show how much it matters for keiki to see trusted adults involved in and enjoying the day with them. When families see PBS Hawai'i staff and volunteers fully engaged, it reinforces that we are here for them not only on screen – but in person and in community.

October also marks the start of a new season of **HIKI NŌ on PBS HAWAII**, Hawai'i's statewide student storytelling initiative. For 18 seasons, students from public, charter and private schools across the islands have used this platform to share their stories and perspectives. Their work reflects the strength and resilience of Hawai'i's young people and we are committed to supporting them as they build skills that will carry them forward.

Nationally, PBS KIDS is adding to that sense of discovery this month. On October 5, **Super Why's Comic Book Adventures** arrives with a fresh, playful way to help preschoolers

build early reading skills. And on October 14, the **Sesame Street** gang joins **Nature** for a special crossover episode that follows Elmo, Abby and Nina as they learn about caring for animals and visit a sanctuary in Kenya. Both premieres offer families more chances to learn together and see trusted characters explore the world with curiosity and heart.

Mahalo for supporting our mission and for believing in the importance of educational media for Hawai'i's keiki. October brings our work full circle, from community events to **HIKI NŌ** storytellers to new PBS KIDS content. Together, we are creating places where children feel safe, curious and connected. That is the heart of PBS Hawai'i and we are honored to carry it forward with you.

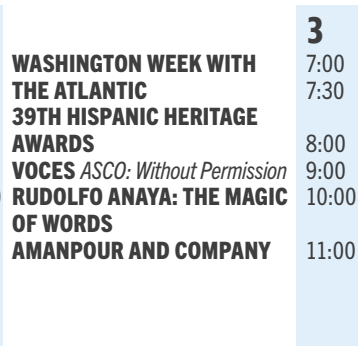

HIKI NŌ on PBS HAWAII is back with all-new episodes this month beginning with Class of 2026, Parts 1 and 2 on October 6 and October 13. This two-part special celebrates standout graduates as they reflect on their HIKI NŌ experiences and the stories, skills and confidence they gained along the way. Their journeys are a testament to the lasting value of HIKI NŌ and its role in empowering Hawai'i's students to share meaningful stories from their communities.

For the first time, the Class of 2026 special also features a middle school student transitioning to high school.

"Being able to tell important stories, it makes me feel like I'm doing something important, like what I'm doing as something fun actually like has an impact on people, and I think that's really meaningful to me," says Eliana Viernes, a recent Maui Waena Intermediate School graduate beginning ninth grade and continuing her media journey at Maui High School.

On October 20, HIKI NŌ launches Season 18 – a new collection of student-produced stories that brings fresh perspectives, compelling voices and meaningful moments from schools and communities throughout

Hawai'i. From stories that inform and inspire to those that reveal the creativity and concerns of a new generation, the season continues HIKI NŌ's mission of giving students a platform to tell the stories that matter to them.

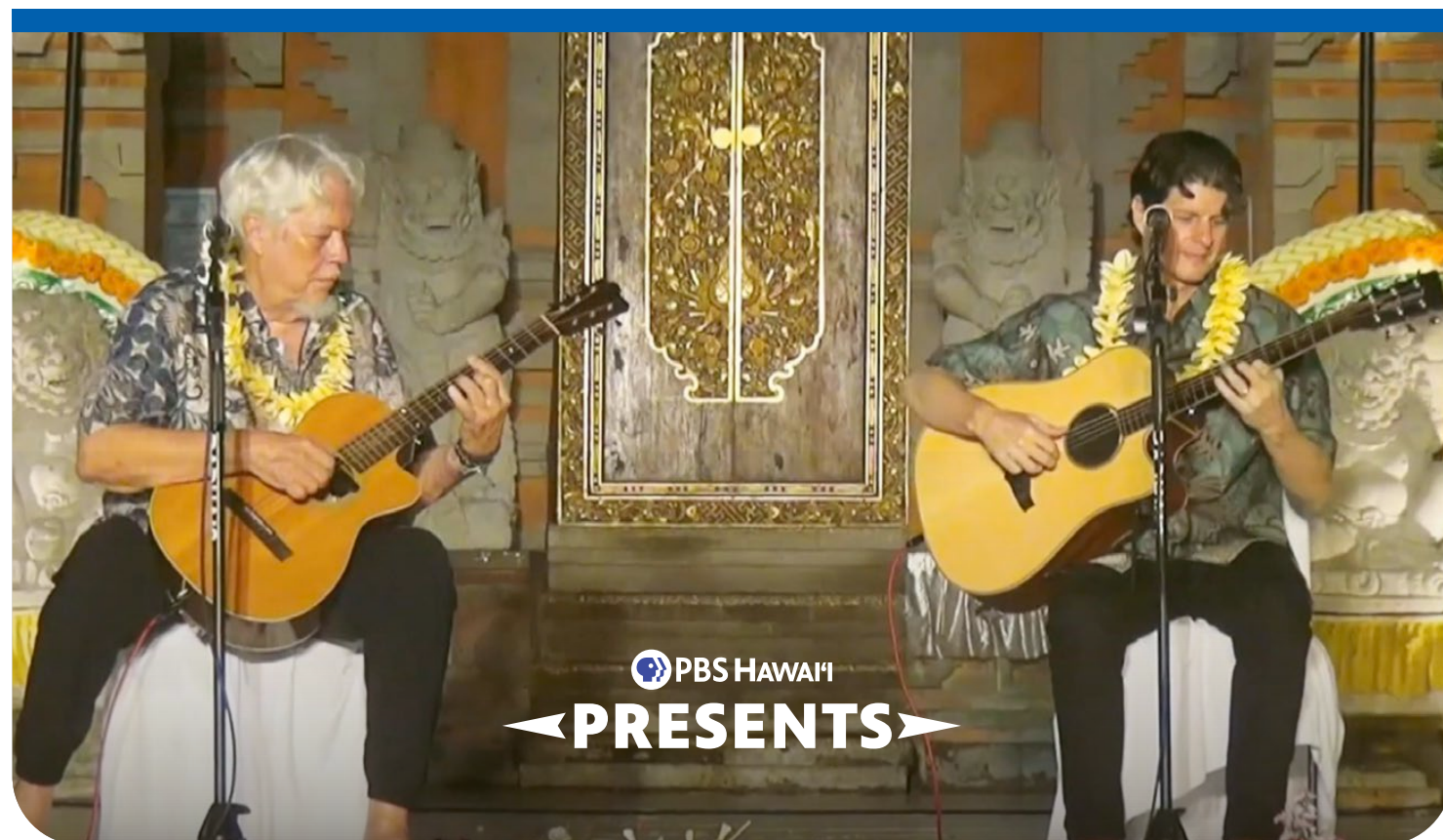

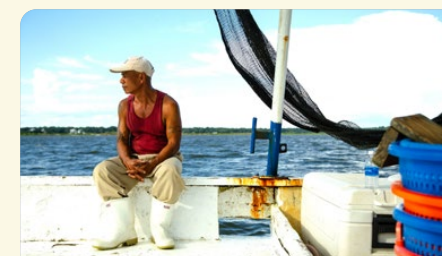

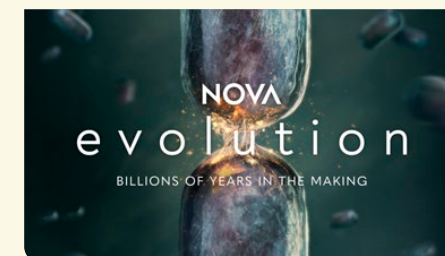
THE FISHER PEOPLE Thursdays, October 8-29, 9:30 pm
